

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PART ONE: COMPREHENSION

Following message is all about malaria, read it and answer the following questions

Malaria is a life-threatening disease. It's typically transmitted through the bite of an infected *Anopheles* mosquito. Infected mosquitoes carry the *Plasmodium* parasite. When this mosquito bites you, the parasite is released into your bloodstream. Once the parasites are inside your body, they travel to the liver, where they mature. After several days, the



mature parasites enter the bloodstream and begin to infect red blood cells. Within 48 to 72 hours, the parasites inside the red blood cells multiply, causing the infected cells to burst open. Malaria is typically found in tropical and subtropical climates where the parasites can live. T

- a) Malaria is caused by when a mosquito infected with the Plasmodium parasite bites you. An infected mother can also pass the disease to her baby at birth and it is known as congenital malaria. Malaria is transmitted by blood, it can also be transmitted through; an organ transplant, a transfusion, or use of shared needles or syringes.
- b) Following the infection, the symptoms of malaria typically develop within 10 days to four weeks. In some people, symptoms may not develop for several months. Some malarial parasites can enter the body but will be dormant for long periods of time. However, malaria has the following common symptoms: shaking chills that can range from moderate to severe, high fever, profuse sweating, headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, anemia, and/or muscle pain, convulsions, coma, and or bloody stools



- c) Malaria can cause a number of life-threatening complications. Including; swelling of the blood vessels of the brain (cerebral malaria), an accumulation of fluid in the lungs that causes breathing problems (pulmonary edema), organ failure of the kidneys, liver, or spleen, anemia due to the destruction of red blood cells, low blood sugar, etc.
- d) There's no vaccine available to prevent malaria. The advice of the doctor can do many things for you if you're traveling to an area where malaria is common or if you live in such an area. You may be prescribed medications to prevent the disease. In addition, your doctor can advice you about a long-term prevention if you live in an area where malaria is common. Also, sleeping under a mosquito net may help prevent being bitten by an infected mosquito. Covering your skin or using bug sprays containing DEET may also help prevent infection.
- e) Malaria is a life-threatening condition. Treatment for the disease is typically provided in a hospital. Doctors prescribe medications based on the type of parasite that you have. In some instances, the medication prescribed will not clear you of the infection. Parasites that are resistant to drugs have been reported. These parasites make many drugs ineffective. If this occurs, your doctor may need to use more than one medication or change medications altogether to treat your condition. he World Health Organization (WHO) estimates that about 3.2 billion people are at risk of malaria.
